UNITY THROUGH KNOWLEDGE CANCELLATION AND REFUNDS


Due to changes in contracting with airlines, charters and hotels, 32nd Street Theater is unable to provide any refunds unless the tour is canceled prior to departure.

SUBSTITUTE PERSON: Students wishing to substitute another person in their place may do so by providing a letter of withdrawal, a new application and an additional \$200 non-refundable deposit.

UNITY THROUGH KNOWLEDGE CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

Our tour package is not responsible for the following:

- Providing participants with spending money or credit loans
- Weather conditions/acts of God
- Future transportation for tour participants who leave the tour and/or who are caught breaking the local laws and/or tour rules (Parents will be notified and will be financially responsible for all remaining transportation, lodging and legal arrangements)
- Any health problems (Before, during or after the tour)
- Property damage and/or extracurricular hotel bills caused by tour participants
- All meals and beverages
- Airport (excess baggage fees) and dining tips
- Additional sightseeing and entrance fees other than those specified in the itinerary.



UNITY THROUGH KNOWLEDGE STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Our tour requires mature behavior in order to ensure everyone's safety and enjoyment. Examples of inappropriate behavior are (but not limited to):

- Disrespect of chaperones, students and tour affiliates
- Fighting or engaging in abusive/physical provoking discussions
- Leaving the tour to visit family, friends and/or for any other reason
- Using profanity or offensive slang language
- Reporting tardy
- Breaking any laws
- Engaging in any form of harassment or sexual activity
- Engaging or possessing any forms of drugs and alcohol
- Entertaining/visitation from members of the opposite sex within a hotel room and/or beyond the designated areas.

UNITY THROUGH KNOWLEDGE DRESS CODE

Females are prohibited from wearing crop tops, strapless, low-cut clothing, clothing with high slits, tops and outfits that provide minimum coverage and clothing that exhibits obscene or controversial slogans or advertising.

Males are prohibited from wearing sagging pants, headgear of any type inside of buildings, and clothing that exhibit obscene or controversial slogans or advertising.

Our tour has set the standard in black college tours by consistently creating new and improved college preparatory programs. We have built our foundation on the philosophy of providing great trips at an affordable price. Our alliance with historical black colleges and Clark County High Schools adds to our credibility, promotion, and awareness. We pride ourselves in honest advertising. Our promotional advertisements are clear, complete, and uncomplicated. We provide a complete college atmosphere, with dormitory style housing, opportunities for our guests to explore and understand travel etiquette, self-responsibility and money management through a non-stop itinerary.

In addition, we understand the need for free time and the freedom to eat as you please. Our company is staffed with experienced chaperones solely dedicated to the objectives and future success of the tour.

Are there any guarantees of college entry?

32nd Street Theater makes no guarantees regarding the admission or scholarship decision of any college or university.

Which universities do you visit?

We offer the following four tour packages that rotate on an annual basis:

THE BAYOU TOUR: ALCORN STATE, DILLARD, GRAMBLING, JACKSON STATE, PRAIRIE VIEW, SOUTHERN, TEXAS SOUTHERN AND XAVIER

THE OLYMPIC TOUR: ALABAMA STATE, CLARK-ATLANTA, FLORIDA A&M, FORT VALLEY STATE MOREHOUSE, MORRIS BROWN. SAVANNAH STATE, SPELMAN AND TUSKEGEE

THE PRESIDENTIAL TOUR: BOWIE STATE, COPPIN STATE, HAMPTON, HOWARD, MORGAN STATE, NORFOLK STATE, VIRGINIA STATE AND VIRGINIA UNION

THE CAROLINA TOUR: BENEDICT, BENNETT, CLAFLIN, FAYETTEVILLE, JOHNSON C. SMITH, NORTH CAROLINA A&T, NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL, SHAW, ST. AUGUSTINE AND WINSTON-SALEM STATE

Can parents attend the tour?

No, but we do encourage parents to visit the campus of choice with their student before paying tuition.

How many students attend a tour?

A maximum capacity is 102 students. We average 55 students per tour (60% female and 40% male).

How much spending money will students need on the tour?

Students are encouraged to bring an estimated **\$300** to cover food and souvenir shopping in the form of cash and/or a debit card.

Can students visit family and friends during the tour?

Students are not permitted to leave the tour for any reason including the visitation of family and friends. However, family and friends may visit students upon the pre-approval of parents and 32nd Street Theater (restrictions will apply and will be discussed during tour meetings).

How do parents stay in touch with their student during the tour?

32nd Street Theater provides a very detailed itinerary that includes the time, location, address and telephone number for every tour visit. Cellular phones and laptops are permitted, but may not be used during tours and seminars.

Who are the chaperones?

32nd Street Theater maintains a 12:1 chaperone to student ratio under the leadership of Rev. Kelcey West (Tour Director), Carmen West, Kevin Winton, Zale Harris, Rev. Jodie Allen, Traci Allen, Rev. Anthony Rankin, Evelyn Rankin, Tracey Ealy, Treda Ealy and Chancellor Davis.

In addition to making sure our chaperones are CPR, we also perform annual background checks.

What are the tour requirements?

In order to ensure congenial membership, 32nd Street Theater reserves the right to accept or reject any person as a tour participant whose conduct is deemed incompatible with the interests of the tour group. All students must be currently enrolled in high school with a minimum 2.0 GPA (transcript required).

What is 32nd Street Theater?

Founded in 1993 by Kelcey West, 32nd Street Theater is a recognized 501 (c) 3 non-profit organization dedicated to performing original theatrical plays, providing motivational speaking seminars and community workshops.

Who Is Rev. Kelcey A. West?

Rev. Kelcey A. West, Tour Director is a 1996 graduate of the UNLV. A native of Pontiac, Michigan, West is the Founder of 32nd Street Theater and the founding Pastor of Nehemiah Ministries Christian Church. His theatrical credits include writing, directing, and producing *Two-Sided Coins* ('93), *A Gift Called Tomorrow* ('94), *Quiet Time To Play* ('94), and *If This World Were Mine* ('95). In 1994, at 23 years of age, West organized the inaugural Bayou HBCU tour with 47 students.

UNITY THROUGH KNOWLEDGE TRAVEL TIPS

Never leave your bags or belongings unattended when traveling. It only takes a few seconds for someone to walk away with your stuff. Even in a bathroom, keep a spare hand on your belongings. Thieves have no shame, they have been known to grab bags from under stalls of a preoccupied traveler.

Lock your suitcases. Most padlocks which come with luggage use generic keys and are very flimsy. Buy a letter key lock or combination lock. Anything that can delay a thief (even by a few seconds) may be enough of a deterrent to prevent a possible theft.

Always keep all valuables (money, traveler's checks, credit cards, jewelry, cameras, etc.) with you at all times. Never put these things in checked luggage. Use a money belt or pack these belongings in your immediate carry-on bag. Don't put anything in checked luggage that you would truly hate to lose.

Be careful if you travel with a laptop computer or camcorder, for they have become the target choice for would be thieves. At an airport, always keep your briefcase, computer case, or camcorder bag with you at all times.

UNITY THROUGH KNOWLEDGE PACKING TIPS

Pack whatever you plan to take then put half of it back. (Most students tend to take far more clothing than necessary)

- Pack shoes that can be used to accommodate various outfits.
- Bring a travel raincoat and/or travel umbrella.
- Try to pack clothes with fabrics that require little care.
- Pack a change of clothes in your carry-on piece of luggage.
- Always pack toiletry sample sizes to conserve space in your luggage.
- For maximum space roll items which do not wrinkle.
- Pack a collapsible and/or expandable bag to carry items you purchase or receive during the tour.
- Put dresses, suits, shirts, etc. in plastic bags to minimize wrinkling.

UNITY THROUGH KNOWLEDGE EMERGENCY GUIDELINES

Air Turbulence: Remain in your seats and follow the captain's and/or stewardess' directions.

Charter Failure: Remain quietly in your seat, and follow the chaperones and bus driver's directions.

Hotel Fire: Report to the bus via the staircases. Do not use any elevators.

Hotel Power Outage: Remain in your room, and notify the chaperones for further assistance.

Tornado, Hurricane, or Severe Thunderstorm: Report and remain in your hotel restroom until given further directions by chaperones and/or hotel officials.

If You and/or A Fellow Student Get Sick During The Tour: Immediately notify the chaperones, and wait for assistance. By no means are you to give or accept medicine from another student and/or administer first-aid.

Health, Security and/or Legal Problems Inside A Shopping Mall: Report to the mall office/security guard and have the chaperones paged. Never engage in any verbal/physical confrontations with anyone.

If A Fellow Students Gets Lost: Report or remain quietly on the bus, and allow the chaperones and officials to form a search team.

Harassment: Please notify a chaperone immediately if you are being sexually, religiously, verbally, and/or physically harassed.

Student Code of Conduct Contract: If someone or persons in your room are jeopardizing your registration by breaking a rule, please notify a chaperone immediately.

UNITY THROUGH KNOWLEDGE MANDATORY STUDENT CHECKLIST

Seniors: Resume, Official Transcript, ACT/SAT Scores, (3) Letters of Recommendation and 500 word sample essay on **LEADERSHIP**.

Seniors must prepare a packet for each school we are visiting

Juniors: Resume, Unofficial Transcript, ACT/SAT Scores, (2) Letters of Recommendation and a 400 word sample essay on **SUCCESS**.

Freshman & Sophomores: Resume, Unofficial Transcript, PSAT Scores, (1) Letter of Recommendation and a 300 word essay on **STRATEGIC PLANNING**

UNITY THROUGH KNOWLEDGE EMERGENCY HEALTH FORM
